## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Ana Agra Association had another productive year in 2017 reaching 38,795 children aged 3-14 and 894 teachers through educational services provided within 9 different projects of varying scales, and all aligned with the contextualized programs developed, including Community-Based Early Childhood Education (CB-ECE), Basic Literacy and Numeracy (BLN), Retention Support, Psychosocial Support (PSS) and School Spirit. By teaming up with legacy partners as well as new partners, Ana Agra was able to bring its best efforts in implementing these programs across all regions in Lebanon.

A key milestone of 2017, a direct result of Ana Aqra's trusted quality of work and sincere commitment to its mission and vision, was the signing of two memorandums of understanding (MOUs) with the following entities:

- Lebanese University- Faculty of Pedagogy
- Center for Educational Research and Development, CERD a national organization charged with modernization and development of education

Ana Aqra's work this year was marked by a more focused and strategic eye towards the sustainability of the services provided. With this more advanced aim of a long term vision, Ana Aqra was able to zoom in on internal methods of planning and implementation to assess their long-term viability, and design new and improved systems.

In parallel with program implementation, Ana Aqra's team remained active and informed by attending a number of relevant educational events, conferences and workshops to keep the momentum of the latest knowledge and skills flowing through the organization.

With the children served remaining at the forefront of our work, Ana Aqra relies on a bottomless source of fuel to continue to bring timely, innovative and quality access to educational services to the communities in need.

Ana Aqra Association is an independent nonprofit organization that advances literacy and autonomous learning for vulnerable children in Lebanese public schools. Founded in 1994 under the name lqra Association, Ana Aqra has since expanded its services to address the educational, cultural and psychosocial needs of communities within and surrounding the public educational system.

Ana Aqra has worked under the auspices of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education from the get go and operates in partnership with other various local and international organizations.

Ana Aqra's programs are implemented across Lebanon and aim to provide equal access, integration and retention of public school children ages 3-14. Programs usually run over a pre-determined period and are customizable to respond to dif-

ferent needs.

Ana Aqra's core programs focus on student integration, student retention and teacher training towards long-term sustainability. As of 2017, Ana Aqra's programs have benefitted 128,570 children, 3,072 teachers, and 17,703 parents/caregivers in 377 public schools.

Ana Aqra's programs are responsive to education during emergency and are aligned with INEE guidelines.



Ana Agra programs represent the overarching framework and defining boundaries under which all projects fall.

All programs respond to the needs of school communities including teachers, learners and their parents.

Program participants, primarily teachers, take part in a 3-6 day capacity building training prior to or during the program implementation. These professional development trainings aim at improving teaching and introducing latest effective practices.

In 2017, Ana Agra worked on 9 projects. All projects served the common goal of paving the way for children to access public school education and increasing their chances of remaining in school and attaining higher education. Ana Agra also partakes in providing training to other national and international NGOs to implement similar programs across the region, including Greece.






CB-ECE

Ana Aqra runs CB-ECE across different regions for children of ages 3-5 years. The CB-ECE program is aligned with the MEHE regulated program and represents a foundational phase to prepare children to transition to formal, compulsory schooling.

In 2017, 4,996 children were reached. Sample results from one school show the following improvement in the skills of 136 learners after attending a ninemonth cycle of the CB-ECE program.


BASIC LITERACY AND NUMERACY PROGRAM

Ana Aqra designed a BLN program to prepare school-aged children, who have either dropped out or have never been to school, for formal enrollment. The program focuses on fostering foundational reading, writing and math skills that are in alignment with the official Lebanese curriculum. This program also aims at preparing school aged children to transition to ALP or formal schooling.

In 2017, 3,780 children were reached. Sample results from one school show the following improvement in the skills of 265 learners after attending a three-month cycle of the BLN program.



The Retention Support Program is comprised of:


- The Summer Remedial Program, which provides extensive support to improve literacy skills across subjects to close achievement gaps for vulnerable learners at risk of dropping out of school.
- The Homework Support Program, supports learners in grades 1 to 9 to independently attend to and complete their assignments. The Program creates a conducive environment in which learners are taught the necessary study skills through learning how to learn and problem solving strategies.

In 2017, 12,575 learners were reached. Sample results from one school show the following improvement in the skills of 3,555 learners after attending 96 sessions over a 3 month cycle of the RS program.



The PSS program is a holistic, targeted and multi-stakeholder program, which is embedded in all of the association's programs. It promotes the wellbeing of the learning communities, including teachers, learners and their parents. The PSS program focuses on ensuring that the children have access to basic services and are provided a safe and inclusive environment. In 2017, 4,023 parents were engaged through parent meeting workshops and awareness sessions.

#### **School Spirit Reading Program**

Ana Aqra designed a reading program that motivates school communities to foster a life-long love of reading. Volunteer-based activities such as installing classroom libraries, reading in classrooms, celebrating the national reading week and visiting book fairs, are conducted towards this long-term aim. In 2017, 1,000 learners were reached.

Ana Agra provides comprehensive training sessions, coaching sessions and curriculum development services. Partners include government, as well as national and international entities. These professional development services fall under either longterm partnerships or consultancies. In this manner, Ana Agra is able to cascade the extensive learning it has gained from 24 years of experience in education, to enhance its social impact, while simultaneously building a platform for its long-term operational and financial sustainability.

In 2017, 774 teachers benefited from training and coaching services through Ana Aqra's program while 205 trainers and teachers benefited from consultancy services.



- 1. Mohamed, Grade 1 learner in Ghazzeh Intermediate Public School was supported through the HWS program under the project "Supporting Vulnerable Girls and Boys to Access and Remain in Education in Lebanon" in partnership with UNICEF. "I am learning so many different things; I can now hold my pen properly". Since his enrollment into the HWS program, Mohamad has been working really hard to improve his performance so he can stay in school.
- 2. 5 year-old Ahmad overcame

- significant learning and behavioral difficulties, including severe tantrums in the classroom, with the assistance of a shadow teacher dedicated to him, and he succeeded in his ECE program under "The Just Right Start" project.
- 3. Iqbal, 14 years old, attended the BLN program within the project "A Second Chance." She attended the program after her ALP morning classes in Al Laylaki Public School where she studies level five so she can enroll in mainstream schooling for the next scholastic year. She is benefitting from English and math, and it is supporting her for the ALP classes that she attends in the afternoon. English is her favorite subject. "I learned how to write stories and use the correct strategies," says Iqbal.
