

Professional Development

Training and Coaching

One of the main triggers for success at Ana Aqra is the continuous planning and working towards building educators capacities and everyone supporting the learning process. Training and coaching teachers are the main ongoing activities that continues to take place at Ana Aqra.

During the year 2023, Ana Aqra team trained around 270 teachers on the Quality Teaching and Learning (QTL) with the focus on implementing different educational programs. These programs included Retention Support, Homework Support, Community Based Early Childhood Education (CBECE), Adult Literacy, Hybrid and Remote learning. Ana Aqra trained teachers working across different projects being implemented across Lebanon: Beirut, Mount Lebanon, North, Akkar, Bekaa and Baalbeck,

A professional development plan is not considered complete without following up on teachers and supporting them while implementing. Thus building teachers capacities continues at Ana Aqra with coaching teachers on the field to ensure that they are able to transfer all acquired knowledge into practice.

Throughout 2023, our focus remained on training and coaching teachers, coaches and trainers, as we believe and as proven that well-equipped and supported teachers and educators enhance the quality of teaching and learning leading to improved student performance.



Psychosocial Wellbeing Services

The Psychosocial Wellbeing Program at the Ana Aqra Association, following a holistic approach in education, aims to support the provision of quality and well-rounded educational experiences for learners, parents, and their communities.

In 2023, Ana Aqra's Psychosocial Wellbeing Department supported the integration of wellbeing programs across all literacy projects of Ana Aqra Association which were implemented in the North, Akkar, Bekaa, West Bekaa, Beirut, and Mont Lebanon.

The program showed to have highly contributed to improve the staff knowledge and positive parenting skills of caregivers. Learners enjoyed safe learning environments, gained social and emotional skills which boosted their academic success, and increased their school attendance and motivation for learning.



The Parental Support Program, an important component of the Psychosocial Wellbeing Program, benefited a total of 3,028 parents. In the Nataf3al project during winter 2023, 659 parents joined the parental program. At the end of the cycle, 279 parents were assessed, and 99% were able to support their children's learning, showing the program's positive impact.

4. Our Resources



"The Just Right Start" Kit

In 2023, Ana Aqra worked with CERD to develop further the ECE teacher training, integrating "The Just Right Start" Kit.

The later was designed and distributed to 808 public schools to support teachers and parents with resources they needed to provide game-based learning and teaching for preschoolers.

The collaboration with DOPS supported the teachers coaching on the new approaches within their training.

Parental Engagement and Improved Home Learning Environment



The "Hafila Hafila" Application



HAFILA HAFILA IS A MOBILE APPLICATION developed by education experts at Ana Aqra.

It combines six games to help children and adults learn Arabic by introducing them to basic language skills. The application is extremely engaging and works both offline and online.

Players can have fun, compete with one another, and learn Arabic all at the same time. Hafila Hafila is used by a number of students in both private and public schools. In 2021, Hafila Hafila was launched on the CRDP Mawaridy platform. All Mawaridy registered users now have access to the application and can acquire a wide range of linguistic skills through play.





The "I Play and Learn with Ana Aqra" Kit

"I Play and Learn with Ana Aqra" is an educational kit that includes seven card games and two board games.

It was designed by Ana Aqra team to improve and support Arabic language acquisitions and it:

- Provides educators with diverse resources to support them in achieving language learning objectives.
- Offers opportunities for formative assessment (teacher-led and selfassessment).
- Encourages learners to participate and communicate.
- Provides authentic language learning opportunities within a student-centered learning environment.
- Fosters collaborative leaning by engaging learners in group play.
- Promotes the development of socialemotional skills.
- Addresses all of the different components of language.









This kit is used by a diverse group of children in schools and across Ana Aqra programs as a primary resource for teachers to facilitate their lessons in teaching Arabic to the entire class, during both guided and independent work.

Digital Units of Lessons for Early Childhood Education



In partnership with Their World and in collaboration with Al Fanar, Ana Aqra and the Lebanese Alternative Learning (LAL) combined their respective expertise and created digital educational materials for the early childhood education, ensuring access to quality teaching and learning. 100 digitized lesson units were developed and revised by the Center of Research and Development (CRDP) of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education.

The lessons identified learning outcomes and their progression, across three languages, are aligned with the literacy components identified within the Ana Aqra model the "QTL: quality teaching and learning" which is endorsed by MEHE, CRDP and Lebanese University supported by the university of PhZug.

Each unit of lesson starts with a read aloud text and includes up to 6 mini lessons targeting Listening Comprehension, Letter Recognition/Phonetics, Phonological Awareness, Sight words, Concept of Print, etc..

The lessons, published on Tabshoura platform, assist teachers, learners and their parents in the successful use of supporting interactive materials and online educational tools.




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Demographic breakdown



Programs

>> QITABI 2- Activity

April 2019- December 2023 Development program

The USAID-funded Quality Instruction Towards Access and Basic Education Improvement (QITABI) 2 is implemented in 882 primary public schools across Lebanon in collaboration with World Learning, ALLC, IRC, and MSI. Ana Aqra leads the Arabic literacy efforts and oversees implementation in 470 schools in Akkar, North Lebanon, Baalbeck/Hermel, and Beqaa regions. In 2023, the project continued the Learning Recovery Program, supporting CRDP in



content preparation and conducting National Teacher Training sessions for phases 3, 4, and 5. Additionally, QITABI2 conducted a second round of food parcel distribution to caregivers of students in grades 1 to 6. The project supported MEHE's 2023 summer program, reaching 580 schools and approximately 150,000 learners across Lebanon. It also completed the production and distribution of 2,736 Grades 5 and 6 Arabic teacher portfolios, reaching over 1,027 private and public schools, as well as CERD and DOPS centers.

>> QITABI 3

The Quality Instruction Towards Access and Basic Education Improvement (QITABI) 3, funded by USAID and led by RTI International, aims to enhance Lebanon's Ministry of Education and Higher Education's (MEHE) commitment to improving education over five years, focusing on inclusive education and increasing literacy, numeracy, and socialemotional skills among children and youth. Building on the successes of QITABI 1 and 2, this initiative, launched in August 2023, targets public and economically



disadvantaged private schools, providing technical assistance to MEHE and CERD in planning, budgeting, delivery, monitoring, evaluation, and institutionalizing educational services. RTI International, in collaboration with World Learning, Inc., Ana Aqra Association, SKILD Center, and INJAZ Lebanon, will implement the program, with Ana Aqra leading Arabic literacy and life skills programs across multiple regions in Lebanon.

>> Makani (My Place): education, protection, community empowerment, and inclusion pathways in Lebanon

Oct 2022 - Sep 2025 Funded by AICS



Led by TDH Italy and partnered with COSPE, Ana Aqra, and the Lebanese League for Women in Business (LLWB), the Makani project, funded by the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS), aims to reduce inequalities in primary education access and prevent school dropouts among vulnerable children in Lebanon. Children aged 3-14 from Souk Al Ghareb and Jbeil regions will access quality and inclusive education in a safe and respectful environment.

The project helps children at risk of dropout by offering retention support programs for ages 6-14, and support for those with learning difficulties. Additionally, it empowers the educating community through awareness-raising activities, training for teachers and school staff, and the development of child protection policies.

Economically vulnerable mothers of at-risk children are also supported through initiatives aimed at economic empowerment, social inclusion, and access to income, including welfare agendas, market analysis, and support for women's economic activities.

>> "My Best Start-2" Project

November 2022-June 2024 Early Childhood Education Program

In partnership with Their World and in collaboration with Al Fanar, Ana Aqra and the Lebanese Alternative Learning (LAL) combined their respective expertise to ensure access to quality teaching and learning through digitized educational materials for the children enrolled in early childhood education and their caregivers. During the year 2021-2022, 100 digitized lesson units with



tips for teachers and parents were developed. During the year 2022-2023, the second phase of the project was allocated to review the digitized lessons before they are published on LAL's platform and other platforms. The lessons assist teachers, learners and their parents in the successful use of supporting interactive materials and online educational tools. Ana Aqra lead the field implementation at its community-based center in Baalback. 180 learners benefited from 2 cycles of early childhood education. The implementation contributed in piloting the lessons and studying their impact on children's performance.



>> Educate to Empower: Empowering 2,990 Individuals through Education in Zahle

Sep 2023 - Feb 2025 Funded by LHF

This project focuses on reducing educational disparities by implementing retention support programs to help at-risk children and improve the well-being of children and their caregivers through PSS/SEL and awareness sessions on education, parenting, health, and mental wellbeing. The project aims to enhance the quality of life for individuals by promoting inclusive education for 2,400 vulnerable children, including Lebanese, refugees, migrants, and children with disabilities, in specific areas of Zahle.

During the 2023-2024 academic year, 1,100 at-risk children from six public schools will receive retention support in community centers. A supplementary summer program in 2024 will support 600 at-risk children from four public schools, and an additional retention support cycle will aid 700 at-risk children in 2024-2025.

All programs include children with disabilities, comprising 3% of the targeted group. The initiative provides teaching materials, transportation, and healthy snacks. Teachers and facilitators receive training to enhance program quality. Additionally, 590 caregivers are participating in awareness sessions to improve their parenting skills and support their children's well-being.





>> "Education Can Not Wait"

August 2022 – December 2024 Early Childhood Education and Basic Literacy & Numeracy Programs

In partnership with Save the Children, the "Education Can Not Wait" project is providing the crisis- affected refugee learners access to non-formal education intervention in order to prepare them to transition to formal education within the parameters of the NFE pathways. The project is also empowering the community stakeholders by promoting an equitable and inclusive learning environment more specifically the teachers and the parents as direct contributors in the learning context.

Through this project, Ana Aqra will target 4250 children who are out of school and not able to join formal education yet. Among those, 2500 children aged between 4 to 6 years old will be enrolled under the Community based- Early Childhood program and 1750 boys and girls ages between 8 to 14 years old will be enrolled under the Basic Literacy and Numeracy programs all in North, Akkar and Mount Lebanon areas. The project is also supporting parents with a positive parenting approach through the parental programs and awareness sessions.

>> Nataf3al

Jan 2021 - Mar 2024 Funded by Agence française de développement (AFD)

Within a consortium consisting of Amel Association, Ana Aqra Association, International Alert and led by the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), the project is



dedicated to reducing educational disparities by implementing retention support programs to help at-risk children and improve the well-being of children and their caregivers through BLP and awareness sessions. The initiative provides teaching materials, transportation, and healthy snacks. Teachers and facilitators receive training to enhance program quality.

By establishing schools as comprehensive support systems, the project aims to empower students to overcome future shocks in education and the wider local and national context. Over a three-year period, the project will support 20 public schools in Beirut, Mount Lebanon, Beqaa, Baalbek, and Akkar, targeting the most vulnerable areas. Through partnerships with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MEHE), the center for education research and development (CERD), and consortium members, Nataf3al will impact over 12,000 learners, 600 teachers, and 3,200 parents.



>> "Second Chance"

September 2023 - August 2024 Retention Support, Basic Literacy & Numeracy, Early Childhood Education, PSS and Parental Programs

In an ongoing partnership with Luminos, the Second Chance project is delivering basic literacy and numeracy (BLN) classes to 550 children aged 10 to 14 in order to assist them in transitioning to the formal schooling system. In addition,600 learners enrolled in public schools are receiving Home Work Support, in a remote modality, to improve their academic performance and wellbeing. A Summer Remedial Program will reach 150 learners, at risk of dropping out of school and will provide intensive remediation to close their achievement gaps. A Community Based Early Childhood Education Program will be also provided to 50 out of school learners to equip them with the needed skills in the 5 main domains- language, psychomotor, cognitive, social and emotional and artistic domain- to prepare them to transition into grade 1 in formal schools.

Ana Aqra will build the literacy and numeracy skills of 80 caregivers in order to support their children's education at home. Ana Aqra will empower additional 150 parents by providing them with self-sufficiency workshops (knitting and planting) that aim to reduce the economic burden and to provide opportunities for future integration in the job market.





Improving the quality of safe, enabling, and stimulating learning environments for early years in formal schools and homes.

January 2023- June 2024 System Strengthening, Early Childhood Education, Teacher Capacity Building

In Partnership with Porticus, Ana aqra aims at improving the quality of stimulating learning environments for early years in formal schools and at homes through the revision and integration of all available digital and hands-on resources, developed by Ana Aqra, within CRDP and DOPS teacher training and coaching as well as through an improved parental engagement component.

Through this project, 48 formal school teachers of 12 public schools will directly benefit from the improved training and coaching components. 12 school directors will pilot and document the effectiveness of the parental engagement program for future scale up. 1000 families will directly benefit from the parental engagement programs endorsed by MEHE. 1000 children, between 3 and 8 years old, will ultimately benefit from the improved teacher training and coaching components and available resources as well as from the implementation of the parental engagement program, endorsed by MEHE.



>> "Ana Kamen" Project

September 2023- September 2024 Early Childhood Education and Basic Literacy & Retention Support

In partnership with WeWorld, the "Ana Kamen" project aims to promote access to inclusive and quality educational services for the Lebanese population and vulnerable refugees, with a specific focus on children with disabilities, through the rehabilitation and energy efficiency of school buildingslead by WeWorld; the implementation of retention support programs and early childhood educational services; the strengthening of capacity of teaching stafflead by Ana Aqra; direct support to children with disabilities; and raising awareness of educating communities on the inclusion



and protection of vulnerable groups-lead by Arc en Ciel. Ana Aqra activities consist of providing two cycles of retention support in 4 public schools for 650 learners and with two cycles of Community-Based Early Childhood Education (CBECE) program for 350 out of school learners. Additionally, it is estimated that about 50 parents of children enrolled in the CBECE program will receive 8 "I can also teach" training sessions that focus on the stages of children's development to increase parents' awareness and preparation in order to promote home learning.

>> Community Based Retention Support project

October 2022 - August 2023

Funded by the Lebanon Humanitarian Fund (LHF)

The Retention Support provision addresses the educational needs of 1200 vulnerable Lebanese, migrant, and refugee children in public schools and 360 children in non-formal education in

Tripoli and Akkar. It aims to prevent 600 at-risk children from dropping out by offering support in community centers. This includes providing winter clothes, classroom supplies, and assistance for children with learning difficulties or disabilities. Teachers will receive training, and parents will attend awareness sessions. Additionally, the program will distribute winterization supplies to 360 children in non-formal education and provide Dignity Kits and menstrual hygiene products to 300 adolescent girls to reduce school absenteeism.



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
